Its all in the name:

Collective Action for Nomadic Small Angle Scatterers

The very first meeting was held in Grenoble France, Feb. 4-6 1998. The stated purpose was:

To figure out a seamless interchange of reduced data.

NOTE:

- This is not yet about a common data format (that comes later)
- While Action was initially Aid, and the focus rather narrow (data), the DNA is set already for advancing SAS through community action

canSAS: who/what is it? Purpose and Goals

An agile "organization" that continually evolves?



A self assembled (grass roots) group of SAS practitioners, users and facility people, who come together to:

- Share and learn about emerging opportunities and new developments in the field and challenges that they pose.
- Build new collaborations
 - Work co-operatively to improve the field for all by:
 - Helping to develop and disseminate best practices
 - Identifying emerging & problem areas and the needs associated with them
 - Improving the state of the art by identifying and providing solutions to the challenges
 - Fostering/Encouraging/Building common "tools" and "language" for SAS practitioners.

canSAS: why "yet another meeting/workshop"

Role of canSAS workshops

Strong overlap with SAS meetings but fulfils different role *It's in the name*

- Presentations looking beyond the "typical data set" from the "world's best" instrument.
 - New directions and opportunities
 - But also -- challenges

You can learn a lot more from failure than success

- Workshops aim to maximize interactions between participants with informal and in-depth discussions
- Workshops provide an opportunity to find some realistic practical solutions that can be worked on NOW.

- Several Round Robins directly and indirectly
- Glassy Carbon available as an SRM
- Github scattering-central created for legacy codes
- 1D format approved May 2009 (1.0) and 2013 (1.1)
- nD ratified by NeXus Inter. Adv. Comm. End of 2016
- IGOR working group resolved conflicts and was sunseted Apr 2015
- Four new working group since 2015 new direction
 - Grazing incidence 2015 (Tokei)
 - SE and TOF-SANS 2019 (Freising)
 - Tomography 2022

canSAS: Working Groups

Working groups (WG) do the actual work (it is in the name)

New ones can be formed and obsolete ones sunseted

Note: some WG also provide structure/tools for others (e.g. Data Formats, Reproducibility and Reliability and Information and Dissemination)

canSAS provide the forum to connect people wishing to address community issues

- canSAS meetings should be participatory
- Don't be shy to share issues or ideas for the community
- Volunteer to contribute to those areas you see as important

canSAS IX: Meeting Orientation

- Working group presentation are short so only clarifying questions
